Tucked away on the coast of the South Bay, Torrance is conveniently located 10 miles south of LAX and 17 miles north of Long Beach Airport. Discover Torrance and enjoy the quintessential California beach experience where hops and flip-flops are the way of life.

MEETINGS AND EVENTS

MUSEUMS

With an impressive collection of fine art from international, national and locally renowned artists, Torrance’s cultural experience is bountiful. PARKS/RECREATION

Torrance boasts more than 90,000 street trees, 33 city parks, a pristine beach on the Pacific Ocean, a 44-acre community park and the Madrona Marsh Preserve & Nature Center. Madrona, the last remaining vernal marsh in LA County, offers visitors a look at a rare wetlands habitat with native plants, wildlife, bird-watching and a nature center.

SHOPPING

Del Amo Fashion Center has 2.7 million square feet of shopping with more than 200 stores in the indoor/outdoor mall. Attracting shoppers from all over the world, Del Amo is the largest mall in the

South Bay and one of the top 10 largest malls in the United States. It is also home to a California Welcome Center, offering travelers tips on exploring Torrance and the Golden State.

TORRANCE BEACH

Stretching 1.5 miles, Torrance Beach is situated between Redondo Beach and Malaga Cove on the Santa Monica Bay and is known for being the “crowd-free” South Bay beach. The 22-mile beach trail—The Strand—welcomes outdoor enthusiasts to explore the South Bay by walking, jogging and biking its paved path.

ATTRACTIONS

Torrance attractions include everything from a historic downtown to the largest farmers market in the South Bay. With a number of cultural venues, museums, shopping and events, Torrance is the perfect destination for groups, couples, families and everyone in between.
